Officer Steven Payne began on April 9<sup>th</sup> and previously worked as a Deputy Sheriff with the Maricopa County Sheriffs Office in Arizona. Both officers are currently completing a Field Training period and are assigned to the Patrol Bureau.

The Lebanon Police Department will use this award to expand and upgrade our Body Worn Camera program.
